The tools could not come at a better time. I have been working with a group of repatriated refugees in Guatemala who have had some help from an NGO in setting up a carpentry shop. Two problems, the first being all the older men who were the carpenters, welders, etc. were killed in a massacre some years back while everyone else in the village fled to Mexico to the refugee camps. They now have their own land with a forest reserve purchased by that same Swiss NGO. The second problem is that there are no hand tools in the village.. The new carpentry shop has saws, shapers, etc. but no blades, no planes, no squares, etc.

Will write more when time permits. I am now out at our little farm where we have no internet connection so I can only come into town once or twice a week to work on the internet...
