The use of simple tools dates to about 2,400,000 BCE when various shaped stones were used to strike wood, bone, or other stones to break them apart and shape them. Stones attached to sticks with strips of leather or animal sinew were being used as hammers by about 30,000 BCE during the middle of the Paleolithic Stone Age. Its archelogical record means it is perhaps the oldest human tool known.



Born 1722, he died just before the French revolution. He was the priest of the Sens Abbey, and as well the chaplain of Madame La Dauphine, Marie Antoinette d'Autriche (future queen of France as Louis XVI wife) as well as the Countess of Provence, (future wife of Louis XVIII). He was a food lover, well known as the owner of the best wine cellar of the time in Paris, especially for his Clos-Vougeot, Montrachet and Haut-Brion wines. Being very close to the nobility and royalty, he was often receiving for dinner the "people" of the time. Many of his friends had a hobby in engineering related skills which was a fashion of the period. Among his guests were Carmontelle, who painted the abbey of Siougeat portrait and was into magic lanterns, Diderot & d'Alembert who wrote their encyclopedias, and Louis the 16th who was a practising locksmith....

This small but very well made vice, adorned with engravings is a testimony of the late 18c, when important people, as he was, were practising trades at a very high level as a hobby.

In November 2015 we sadly lost Don Wing.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank him and his wife Ann for their incredible contribution to the research and knowledge in the world of antique tools and the history of planemaking.



This 700 page book is the first major reference work on the subject, giving tool collectors and historians what is probably the largest source of names in tool making and retailing. In form it was inspired by the 3rd edition of British Planemakers, and the 500 page directory is similar in layout, giving locational and biographical information on over 1000 makers and dealers.

Most of the 2000-plus illustrations are of saws from the author's collection, supplemented from the riches of the Ken Hawley Collection in Sheffield, where much of the research was done, and by unusual marks sent by friends world wide.


There are fully illustrated chapters on how saws were made, on the main centres of manufacture, and how the changing appearance and design of saws, handles and decorative medallion screws enable a saw to be dated.

A chapter on types of saw amplifies the entries in Salaman's Dictionary.
