Tony,

I don't know about safe and sound but all the tools are loaded in the back of my truck and ready for transport to Chiapas. I have made a list of everything so that I will try and avoid as many taxes at the border as I can (they have a kind of VAT tax of 16%) so I lie and tell them my grandfather and father gave it all to me.. If all else fails I will give them a bribe... Also found a nice 14" band saw, a small (6") jointer and some larger circular saw blades (16 and 18 inch to be used in a new small saw mill I am setting up for Yalambajoch.) We'll see.. Meanwhile I head back down to the border on the 7th of June, With luck to Veracruz the following night and finally San Cristobal on the 10th.. Roads are good, the only problems are with the military and the Narcos... Saludos, Richard

I got word from the Casa Juan Diego which is the Catholic Worker in Houston (also a center for housing Migrants) that the tools have arrived in Houston. I will be heading up to Texas from Chiapas in Mid May to pick up those tools and some others I had no room for on my last trek. Specifically a great Band Saw and a small lathe.

My work in Guatemala with the repatriated refugees (mostly Chuj Indians) is coming along. We now have 3 young trained kids who came to San Cristobal for a years class in basic carpentry so that now they all know the operation of the larger tools. Good kids all, mostly 17, or thereabouts. They are all working in the communal shop producing doors, windows, cabinets, etc. The one girl who took the class is making wooden toys.

It is a grand life for me down here. My shop is usually filled with old guys learning to make furniture for their children or grandchildren. If I could only teach them to not abuse the tools life would be perfect.. Thanks again for the wonderful donation of tools.

I think it was Buckminster Fuller who said, The real wealth of a country is in it's tools. Saludos, Richard

I finally got to pick up the tools you shipped to houston. The Catholic Worker house ended up using some of them but I got most of them and will take them back down to my carpentry project in Guatemala next month. I am in San Antonio house sitting for a friend until the 1st of July. Will head up to Omaha and Des Moines for a bit of fundraising and return around the 30th of August.

The carpentry shop in Yalambajoch is coming along. The village was the site of a massacre in the early 80's during the Civil War when 160 men were killed while the women and children fled for Mexico to refugee camps where they lived for 25 years. Eventually an NGO from Switzerland bought them their land back along with a 350 hectar forest. The NGO built them a carpentry shop with some major tools but 3 problems emerged. First, all the carpenters had been killed in the massacre so there were no Seniors to lead them. Second, the NGO bought machine tools but no hand tools. (there is not a single hammer, level or plane in the shop...) Finally, the Indigenous there have a habit of lending tools which do not come back.

I have arranged for 2 scholarship for 2 young people to go and live in San Cristobal and attend a course in the use of hand tools in carpentry. If they finish well in the hand tool course they can continue on with a 2nd 4 month course in the use of machine tools building windows and doors.

Along with the above I have been trying to set up a carpenter from San Cristobal to go to Guatemala for a year to head up the shop, build benches, devise an inventory system, get people working, etc. I am currently trying to raise the 700 dollars a month for the carpenter (who is a master) who would live in the village and run the shop for a year...

Trussing the cooper at Truman's Brewery

Cooperage in Spital St.

More than a quarter century has passed since the Truman Brewery closed in Brick Lane in 1989 and it is hard now to imagine the teeming life of the place that sustained itself over three centuries of brewing on this site.

But thanks to the British Pathe archive of news footage, I was permitted a startling glimpse of the lively community that was once here. *Trussing the Cooper* records a traditional apprentice's initiation ritual of humiliation in 1954.

The apprentice, Gordon Wright of Bromley in Kent, is put in a barrel, covered with all kinds of filth and rolled around until he emerges coated in grime to be presented with a pint of ale, now a fully fledged cooper.

It is a powerful cinematic cameo with a gleeful Dionysiac energy thatt across the intervening half century, thrusting us into the joyful heart of their world. Whatever else was going on, these people certainly knew how to make their own fun - but I am glad I was not the one in the barrel. To his eternal credit, Gordon takes it all in great spirit. Maybe he had a couple of pints already to give him some dutch courage?

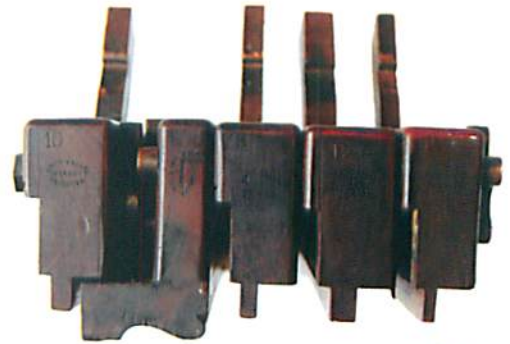

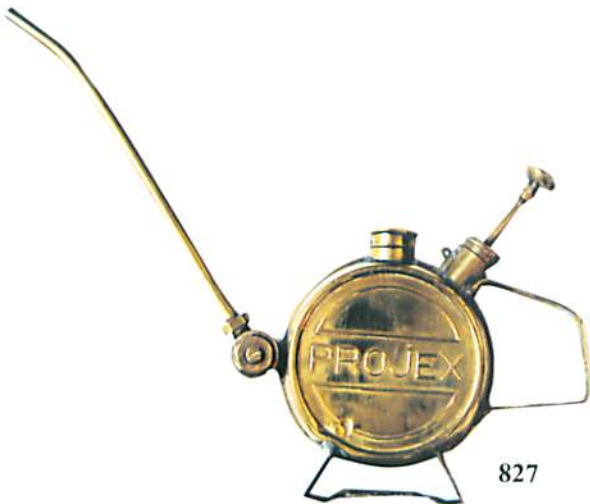
